

The National VET Research landscape

1. Existing AVETRA Memoranda of Understanding.

AVETRA has established a number of MOU's with related organisations. What is important about these relationships is what the subsequent relationships between the organisations has achieved. Interestingly, negotiations for a MoU with NCVER began in 2007 but were never completed as the contractual relationship for the mentoring program took priority. It may be that what actually matters to AVETRA is the quality of the continued interaction with external bodies and not formal MoUs.

The current draft AVETRA MoU is listed as Appendix 1.

NQC

National Quality Council – will cease in 2012 and become the NSC for **VET.** The NQC is a Committee of the Ministerial Council for Tertiary Education and Employment (MCTEE), and oversees quality assurance and ensures national consistency in the application of the Australian Quality Training Framework standards for the audit and registration of training providers. It has specific decision-making powers in relation to the endorsement of Training Packages and other aspects of the quality assurance under the National Skills Framework. The National Quality Council has a key role in bringing together the major players in the vocational and technical education sector - industry, unions, governments, equity groups and practitioners - to oversee and support the current and future quality of vocational and technical education across Australia. NARA

National Audit and Registration Agency - COAG agreed to the creation of a new national regulator for the VET sector from April 2011 - National Standards Council for Vocational Education and Training. The new regulator will be a Commonwealth statutory authority. The assumption is that in 2013 there will be a single regulator for all the tertiary sector. All jurisdictions except Victoria and Western Australia have agreed to refer powers to the Commonwealth to implement the national regulator. The aim of the national VET regulator is to generate positive results for training providers, VET students, and the Australian economy. The national VET regulator's enhanced risk-management approach to audits will place greater emphasis on those providers with the highest risk profile, benefiting the lowest-risk providers and provide an incentive for all providers to maintain and improve the quality of their delivery.
